

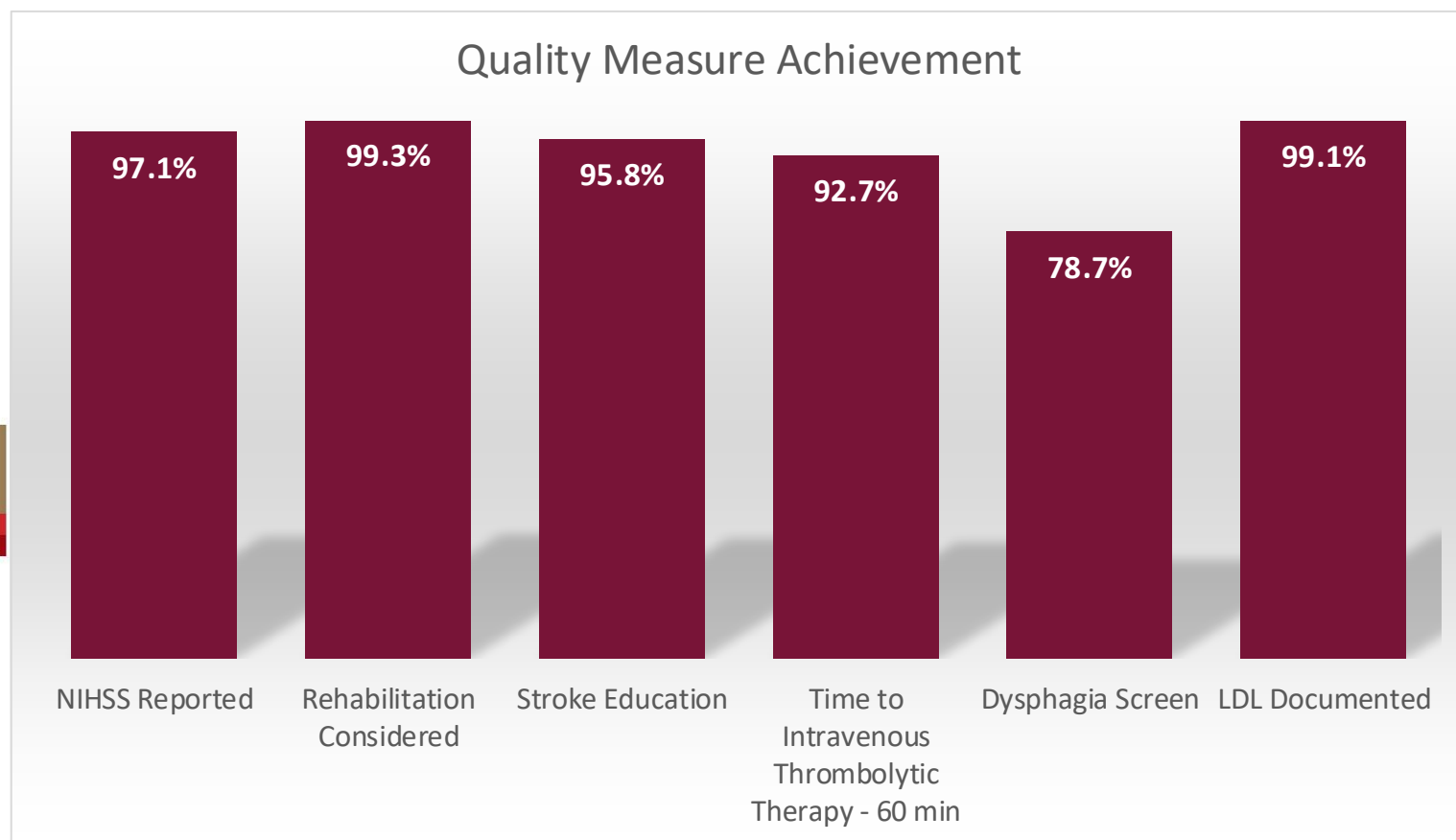


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Loyola Stroke Program Outcomes

Achieved 75% or higher with four or more of the AHA GWTG Quality Measures for over two years

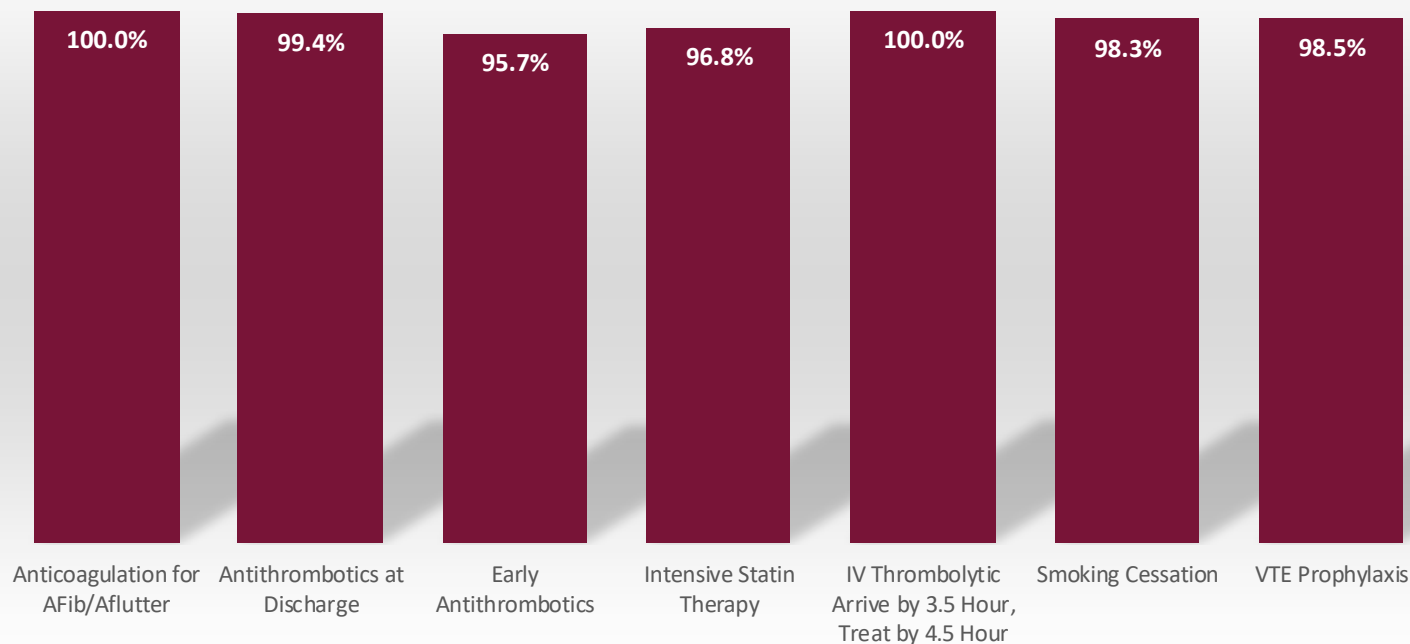


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Target: Stroke Gold Plus Honor Roll Elite

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Successful Reperfusion Following Endovascular Stroke Treatment

86 % of patients achieved blood flow restored to the brain following endovascular treatment.

Why This Matters

Restoring blood flow quickly is one of the most important factors in improving outcomes for patients experiencing an ischemic stroke.

- Ischemic stroke patients may be eligible for a surgical procedure to remove the clot that is blocking blood flow to the brain



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Door-to-Needle Time for IV Thrombolytic Therapy

What Is IV Thrombolytic Therapy?

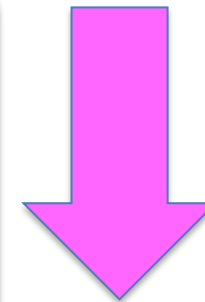
IV thrombolytic therapy is a clot-busting medicine given through a vein to dissolve blood clots causing an ischemic stroke. Rapid treatment can help restore blood flow to the brain and improve recovery.

Why This Matters?

The faster the medicine is given; the sooner blood can reach the brain. This may help reduce brain damage and improve recovery.
